



Brass instruments have come a long way since the days of the keyed bugle, the ophicleide and the serpent. Who nowadays remembers the glorious sounds of the emboliclave, the koenighorn or the herculesophone? The sound of the hellhorn can only be guessed at, and might be better left to the imagination. Given such a pedigree, it is no surprise that brass instruments have been, relatively speaking, late bloomers.

Late bloomers perhaps, but in the hands (and lips!) of CAPITAL BRASSWORKS, the pioneering sounds of old assume a modern and glorious resonance. CBC Records presents the group's new CD: From Russia with Brass! What better repertoire to explore than that of the Russian composers who, through their innovative orchestrations discovered exotic and mysterious sounds and exploited extremes of range, dynamics and virtuosity? Their rich palette of orchestral colours is brilliantly captured in this recording's extraordinary arrangements of Russian classics for brass, organ and percussion. Your senses will be tantalized as you listen to Mussorgky's Pictures at an Exhibition, arranged by trombonist and Capital BrassWorks co-founder Colin Traquair, or excerpts from Tchaikovsky's ballet, The Nutcracker. Alexander Borodin's Polovtsian March is another priceless musical nugget as is the spectacular arrangement of Rimsky-Korsakov's Procession of the Nobles and the hauntingly beautiful version of Rachmaninov's famous Vocalise with cornet soloist Karen Donnelly. Trombonist Angus Armstrong adds spectacular arrangements of Sabre Dance, Russian Sailor's Dance and selections from Spartacus.
